




THE CONSORTIUM AIMS TO:

Ensure the self-sustainability of students, ATO veterans, unemployment center applicants and career-transitioning engineers by equipping them with the skills and knowledge needed for employment in the digital game sector.

Promote professional development in digital game industry among universities' faculty staff, teachers and researchers, as well as among trainers at unemployment and job consulting centers.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES:
